A NOTE FROM PASTOR'S DESK - MAY and JUNE

I have but one last request of you. Pray, Pray, Pray for Meghan and me as we begin this next part of the journey; as we pack, move and settle into the new place. Pray for us as we begin ministry with our new appointment that God may be glorified in all that we do. This will be greatly appreciated. Pray for Pastor Tina and her husband, as they finish at their current appointment, packing and beginning to settle in here in Tyrone. Pray for your church. Pray that as people of Wesley that you may continue to be in ministry and

desire to be one with Christ, one with each other and one in ministry to all the world until Christ comes in final victory and together we are reunited in God's kingdom. This will be my prayer and I hope that you will join me in these prayers; for prayer is powerful, prayer is meaningful and prayer is life changing. May God's grace and love fill you now and forever.

THE EASTER SEASON AND CHANGE

Lent and Easter Sunday have come and gone, but the Easter season remains. What is this you ask? In the church, this is the period of time when we should study, reflect, and celebrate the events of Jesus' resurrection, his visits with the women and the disciples, his visits with others, the messages he left for the disciples and others, the forgiveness he showed Peter, and all the other events that led up to the ascension of our Lord and Savior. Easter season is the seventh week period between Easter Sunday and Pentecost.

The Christian holiday of Pentecost, which is celebrated on the seventh Sunday after Easter, commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks, as described in the Acts of the Apostles. Some Christians believe this event represents the birth of the Church. It does signify an important event in the history of the early Church that enabled the rapid spread of Christianity. Within a few decades important congregations had been established in all major cities of the Roman Empire.

The biblical narrative of Pentecost is given in the second chapter of the Book of Acts. Peter's sermon in Acts 2: 14-36 stresses the resurrection and exaltation. In his sermon Peter quotes Joel 2:28-32 and Psalms 16 when speaking to the people. About one hundred and twenty followers of Christ (Acts 1:15) were present, including the twelve apostles, Jesus' mother Mary, other female disciples and his brothers. Peter stood up with the eleven and proclaimed to the crowd that this event was the fulfillment of prophecy. In Acts 2:17, it reads: "And in the last days,' God says, 'I will pour out my spirit upon every sort of flesh, and your sons and your daughters will prophesy and your young men will see visions and your old men will dream dreams." Acts 2:41 then reports: "Then they that gladly received his word were baptized: and the same day there were added unto them about three thousand souls." This event was the beginning of a continual outpouring that would be available to all believers from that point on, Jews and Gentiles alike.

Jesus' life, death, resurrection, and commissioning caused many changes in the lives of his apostles. They chose to change; they chose to be the leaders. They went forward and did the work they were called to do after they were empowered by the Holy Spirit.

But what about us? How do we handle change? Change can be frightening or it can be exciting! Do we embrace it and work with it, do we run and hide from it, or do we just go on our merry way as we have done in the past. After we experience and participate in Lent and Easter, what do we do? Are we filled with the Holy Spirit and ready to make a change in our world and the world around us? Do we join with other believers in spreading the good news, do we reach out to meet the needs of others following Jesus' request "to feed my sheep". This year Pentecost will occur on Sunday, May 20th and again we will have an opportunity to follow Jesus and reach out in service.

Soon our Wesley UMC family will face change once again. Pastor David will be leaving and a new pastor will be joining us. The Methodist policy with regard to the assignment of ministers is an itinerant system which means the ministers are moved when there is a need. Sometimes the move is the request of the pastor, sometimes it is requested by the church family and sometimes it is the conference who asks for and makes the move. Every pastor has gifts that come from God, but not all pastors have the same gifts nor do they have all of the gifts that God has given. In serving a congregation, a pastor is placed because the conference believes they have the gifts to meet the needs of the congregation. Also, all church members have gifts that when shared may help the pastor grow in his/her ministry.

So, as we say good-by to Pastor David and Meghan, we wish them well in their new ventures in serving our Lord. We pray that God will continue to bless them. God has a plan for all of us; our church family, Pastor David and Meghan, and our new pastor. Are we ready for what God has in store for us? This change can be the beginning of a new and fantastic journey in serving our Lord. Let's embrace it!!

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Staff Parish Relations Committee: On Sunday, April 15, Dr. Kathy Kind, District Superintendent, introduced the committee to our new Pastor, Tina Hawkins. Pastor Tina has been appointed as a full-time local pastor to Wesley United Methodist church starting July 1, 2018. She was called by God throughout her life, serving in many volunteer roles in the church including secretary, janitor and lay speaker before she finally left her full-time job to pursue her theological education at the Methodist Theological School in Ohio.

For the past 12 years, Pastor Tina has been serving churches in the Morrisdale/West Branch region and currently has four charges. She feels community outreach, visitation, children's programs, and prayer are important ministries as well as establishing good working relationships with other churches in the community. In addition to caring for her congregation. Pastor Tina said she also wants to reach out to "the least, the last and the lost" to make Disciples of Christ. She added that she believes in not asking others to do something she wouldn't do! Pastor Tina and her husband Herb are the parents of four grown children and there is a special connection to Wesley. Herb is Maribeth LeGrand's brother.

We will learn more details in May about the moves. In the meantime, continue to keep both Pastor David and Pastor Tina and their families in our prayers as they transition to their new charges.

Trustee Committee: As reported in last month's newsletter new carpet will be installed in the sanctuary as well as the chancel area. The carpet was shipped from California on April 19 and should arrive by the end of April and the installation should be sometime in May. The plan is for the installation to be done so that we are only out of our sanctuary for one Sunday if all goes well. On that Sunday, we will hold Sunday morning service in Fellowship Hall.

Pastor David's Commissioning: Annual conference will be held May 31-June 2 at the Hershey Lodge. Saturday, June 2, Pastor David will be commissioned, which will put him one step closer to ordination; one step closer to fulfilling his dream of ministry and God's plan for his life. If anyone from the congregation would like to attend this service they are welcome to do so; contact Pastor David for details. Congratulations and best wishes Pastor David, from all of us. May God bless you as you continue to serve Him.

Worship Committee: In 2017, members of Wesley met to discuss our worship services. From this meeting, it was decided to form a new committee to assist in coordinating a well-rounded meaningful service. Questions asked were "Are we making the most of the time we spend in worshiping our Lord" and "Can we find ways to make it better?" At the end of the year, Darlene Ritter was elected to serve as the chair of this committee, effective January 1, 2018.

Darlene has been having conversations with the people who serve during worship. Members of the Committee are Myra Hess, Music; the lead usher of each usher team; Karen Rumberger, Acolytes, one or two of our Nursery Attendants, Joyce Hewel; Altar Guild; and Lori Eckert, Communion Steward.

We have recruited five new nursery attendants. With these additional volunteers joining our former volunteers, we will be able to have two people in the nursery for all services. Security is a top priority and Darlene will continue to work with and seek input from our usher teams with the hope of keeping our sanctuary and Sunday School building as safe as possible.

During May, Darlene will be scheduling meetings with all of the different groups involved to gather their thoughts and input on the services. She will also continue to work with LeVonne Angelo in preparing the bulletins for our services. LeVonne will continue to schedule the nursery workers and the greeters.

<u>Confirmation Classes:</u> On Sunday, April 15th Wesley Church had the pleasure of welcoming Haylee Foster and Annie LeGrand as full members of Wesley United Methodist Church. The young ladies had attended 16 weeks of preparatory classes under the direction of Pastor David. Both Haylee and Annie have been attending Wesley for years along with their family. We are so grateful for these new members and ask for God's

blessing for each of them as they continue on their path to serving Him.

New Ministries

"Meals Ministry" has been formed to serve those in need at Wesley. We will provide meals for new mothers, and for those who have returned home from a hospital stay. Meals are homemade or purchased by volunteers and will be delivered to those in need.
